VISA REQUIREMENTS

Countries visited: Belgium, Germany, Austria, Italy, Yugoslavia, Bulgaria, Turkey, Syria, Jordan, Greece, Pakistan, India, Nepal.

Visa requirements depend on your nationality and details are listed below. Please note that Syrian and Indian visas (where applicable) cannot be obtained at the land border checkpoints and must be obtained before departure by those nationals specified below.

Passport size photos: You should carry at least 6 spare passport size photos when travelling. Never lock them away in your suitcase, keep them handy. Carry extra photos if you need to obtain visas en route.

Yugoslavia: Transit visa required by Australian, New Zealand, Canadian and USA citizens. Not required by UK*, German, Dutch or Belgian citizens. Bulgaria: Visa required by all mationals.

Turkey: Visas not required by UK, Australian, New Zealand, Canadian, USA, German, Dutch or Belgian citizens.

Syria: Double Entry Visa required by all nationals.

Jordan: Visa required by all nationals.

Greece: Visas not required by UK, Australian, New Zealand, Canadian, USA, German, Dutch or Belgian citizens.

Pakistan: Visa not required by UK*, Australian, New Zealand, Canadian, USA, German, Dutch or Belgian citizens.

India: Tourist visa required by USA, Dutch and Belgian citizens. Visas not required by UK*, Australian, Canadian, New Zealand and German citizens.

Nepal: Visa required by all nationals,

* UK Passports: Persons holding UK passports with the prefix C or D to the number require a Foreign Office re-entry stamp and also require a visa for Pakistan and India. If your passport shows "British Subject" but not "Citizen of the United Kingdom" you will also need a visa for India.

IMPORTANT: Local regulations prohibit entry into Syria and Jordan to those of the Jewish faith, Jehovah's Witnesses and anyone whose passport shows that the holder has visited Israel.

VISA ASSISTANCE: It is important that visas should be obtained before departure. If you wish Pennworld London to obtain visas for you, please contact our office at 15A Soho Square, London WIV 5FB (Telephone 01-434 2956, Telex 888777) with your passport and passport size photos at least 3 weeks prior to your departure from the UK. A service and visa fee will be charged.

HEALTH REGULATIONS

You must be in possession of an International Certificate of Vaccination against Smallpox and Cholera - a combined Cholera/TAB (Typhoid) vaccination is strongly recommended. We also suggest a Tetanus injection and Polio booster. As late as possible before départure we also suggest a Gamma-globulin injection as a measure of protection against hepatitis. Anti-malaria tablets (Paludrine, Daraprim or similar) should be taken.

We cannot carry passengers without the correct vaccination certificates.

From Pennworld's London Terminus at Mayfair Place, through the medway towns to Dover - ENGLAND/BELGUIN - (cross English Channel 3] hrs voyage). Belgian port of Ostend and cross Plain of Flanders to Ghent (embroidery centre, medieval architecture).

Ghent, Brussels (Capital) liege,

3 Heidelberg - Innsbruck (320 miles) Bate 23 September 1980

Heidelberg, rejoin Autobahn to Karlsruhe, Stuttgart, pass Castle of

Teck, Swabian Aips, Ulm (River Danube, Cathedral), Munich (beer festival, arts and industrial centre), Bavarian Alps, Kiefersfelden - GERMAN/AUSTRIAN border - Kufstein, fortress village of Rattenburg, Karwendel Mountains, Innsbruck (Capital of Tirol province, old centre of the Hapsburgs).

4 <u>Innsbruck - Venice</u> (260 miles) Date .24.September.1980....

Innsbruck, sweeping mountain motorway crossing Europa Bridge (Europe's highest) to the Brenner Pass -AUSTRIAN/ITALIAN border - spectacular scenery, Isarco Valley (several medieval castles), Fortezza, Dolomites (10,000 ft), autostrada across fertile plains to Mestre (industrial centre) and cross Causeway to Venice.

5 In Ventce

Date .25.September.1980.....

Former Maritime Republic: St Mark's Square, Ducal Palace, Bridge of Sighs, Campanile Tower, St Mark's Basilica, Rialto Bridge, shopping, canal trips.

6 <u>Venice - Beograd</u> (300 miles) Date .26.Şeptember 1980.....

Venice, cross the fertile plains of the Tagliamento and Piave Rivers, Trieste - ITALIAN/YUGOSLAYIAN border - Kozina, Rijeka (major port, export and industrial centre), coastal route by the impressive fiord - like Bay of Bakar, and resort towns of Kraljevica and Novi Yinodolski, Senj (16th century fortress), Karlobag, Podgorski Canal, Zadar (port, industry) to the small fishing village of Beograd-na-Maru.

7 <u>Beograd - Dubrovnik</u> (240 miles) Date .27 September 1980

Beograd, south past Sibenik, views of Zlarin Island, Trogir, Split (Emperor Diocletian's Palace and walled medieval town, modern port), coastal highway along cliffs and bays - spectacular views, Neretva Delta (unusual local boats), walled Dubrovnik.

8 In Dubrovník Date 28 September 1980

A fascinating city; once an ancient independent Republic, the walled city is completely preserved. Churches, Rectors Palace and fortifications to explore. Boat trips out to nearby islands available.

9 <u>Dubrovník - Titograd</u> (100 miles) Date 29 September 1980

Dubrovnik, Konavli Valley, Hercegnovi (castles), ferry across Bay of Kotor to Tivat, Budva (walled town of Greco, phoenician origin), Sveti Stefan (fortified Island 'restored' as a hotel town), ascend 2,200 ft hairpin bends, views of Adriatic Coastline, Virpaza, Lake Skadorska Causeway, Titograd (formerly Podgorica, industrial centre of Montenegro).

Days

Titograd - Skopje (240 miles)
Date .30 September 1980

Titograd, follow Moraca River Valley, ascend to top of Crkvice Pass via 30-odd road tunnels through wooded mountains, Kolasin, Ivangrad (wood pulp plant, cellulose), Kosovska, Mitrovic, Pristina (metallurgical industries, old town, modern suburbs). Skopje (Capital of Macedonia, university city, earthquake prone, rebuilt suburbs).

11 Skopje - Sofia (190 miles)
Date .l.October.1980.

Skopje, Kumanovo, famous for Serbian Victory over the Turks in 1912 (timber and tobacco industries), east to Kriva Palanka - YUGOSLAV/BULGARIAN border - Gjuesevo, Kjustendil (thermal resort and commercial centre for apples, cherries, plum brandy and tobacco), Stanke Dimitrov, Kocermovo (tobacco) Rila Monastery (3760 ft), historic centre of Bulgarian culture, Sofia.

12 <u>In Sofia</u> Date .2.October 1980

Capital, main economic and cultural centre, at the foot of Mount Vitosa; Lenin Square, Church of St Petka, Mosque of the Baths, central market, former Royal palaces now Gallery of Art and Ethniographic museum, Russian Church of St Nicholas, the magnificent Alcksandar Nevski Cathedral and 900 acre Freedom Park.

13 Soffa - Edirne (212 miles) Date . 7.9ctober 1980.

Sofia, Constantinople road, Intiman (beautiful scenery), Kostenec (match and paper factories), Pazardzik (fruit, early vegetables), to Plovdiv second city in Bulgaria and one of the oldest towns in the Balkan Peninsular. Haskovo, an important centre of tobacco growing, also large textile works and canning factories, Harmanli (silkworm-breeding), Svilengrad -BULGARIAN/TURKISH border - Edirne (ancient Adrianople, ottoman mosques).

14 Edirne - Istanbul (150 miles)
Date 4 October 1980

Edirne, Luleburgaz (16th century mosque by Sinan), Turkish Thrace, Silivri, follow shores of sea of Marmara to Istanbul on the bosphorus.

15/16 <u>In Istanbul</u>
Dates .5/6.0ctober 1980....

Ancient Capital of Eastern Roman/ Byzantine Empire, formerly Constantinopic: Aya Sofia, Sultan Ahmet mosque. Yerebatan Serai (underground water cisterns), Archaeological Museum, Galata tower, cruise on Bosphorus grand covered bazaar.

17 <u>Istanbul - Ankara (275 miles)</u> Date .7 October 1980

Leave Europe by crossing the Bosphorus to Asia Minor. Continue round Sea of Marmara to Izmit (ancient Nicomedia). Cross plain of Adapazari (cotton). climb through pine forests to Bolu and Kizilcahaman to the Anatolian plateau and the Capital of Ankara.

18 Ankara - Urgup (205 miles) Date .8.0ctober.1980......

Before leaving Ankara we visit the Mausoleum of Kemal Ataturk and the excellent little Hittite museum. Then cross open steppe country, oast Tuz Golu to Aksaray, Nevsehir (regional capital, Seljuk-Ottoman fortress, vineyards) and through fantastic erosion area to Urgup, a small village by the Goreme Valley.

19 In Urgup (Goreme Valley)(50miles) Date .9. October. 1980......

Urgup (fruit, wine, carpets). Rock dwellings in cliffs above town. Excursion to Goreme Valley, centre of Cappadocian region famed for strange landscapes of "tufa" "fairy chimneys" and decorated rockcut churches hollowed from the soft tufa formed by eruptions of Erciyes Dag volcano.

20 Urgup - Adana (185 miles) Date .10.October.1980.....

Urgup village, travel south across fertile plains of central plateau to Nigdi, Pozanti, pass through the Cilician Gate (old strategic Pass), and descend through the Taurus Mountains, Tarsus (home of St Paul) to Adama (cotton).

21 Adama - Latakia (170 miles) Date .11.0ctober.1980.....

Adama, Toprakkale (Frankish/ Armenian fortress), Iskenderun. Antakya (ancient Antioch, one of the three great cities of the world after Rome and Alexandria), -~TURKISH/SYRIAN border - Kessab, to Latakia (Syria's main port, centre for figs, alives and tobacco).

22 Latakia - Damascus (225 miles) Date .12.0ctober.1980.....

South along the Mediterranean Coast to Banias and Tartus (Templar's Castle), turn inland to Tell Kalakh (Krak des Chevaliers - 12th Century Crusader Castle), then continue east to Homs (Syria's third largest City) and south to Nebek, Qtaife and Damascus, the Capital of Syria.

23 In Damascus Date .13.0ctober.1980......

Damascus was a political, religious and cultural centre of Islam under the Omayad Caliphs; visit the Great Omayad Mosque containing the Tomb of Saladin and the head of John the Baptist, the citadel and labyrinth of souks under the old walls, El Azam Palace, the Street called Straight, the National and Folklore

24 Damascus - Amman (130 miles) Date .14.0ctober.1980......

'Damascus, south via Meskine, Deraa - SYRIAN/JORDANIAN border - Ramatha, Jerash (ancient Gerasa, ruined Graeco-Roman city, fine colomnaded

avenue and semi-elliptical Forum), Amman (capital city, Roman Theatre).

25 Amman - Petra (168 miles) Date .15.October.1980......

Amman, south via the desert highway, Quatrana, Maan, Wadi Musa, Petra "The Rose Pink City" (ancient rockcaves, capital of the Nabataen Empire, Roman ruins, magnificent Treasury, tombs, temples, cave dwellings).

26 Petra - Agaba (85 miles) Date .16.0ctober.1980......

Morning to explore Petra, then return to main Desert Highway, Ras en Nagb (panoramic view of Wadi Rum area) descend to Aqaba on the Gulf.

27 In Agaba

Date .17.0ctober.1980......

Full day in Agaba situated at the head of the Gulf of Agaba from where you can look across the Israeli Border to the Port of Eliat, small modern town, beaches, coral reefs, swimming.

Agaba - Amman (210 miles) Date .18.0ctober.1980......

Return north on same Highway Via Maan to Amman, built on seven rough hills, old and modern districts,

29 Amman - Damascus (130 miles) Date .19.0ctober.1980.....

Amman, Sweileh, Jerash, Ramatha JORDANIAN/SYRIAN border - Deraa,

30 Camascus - Palmyra (205 miles) Date _20.0ctober_1980,.....

North from Damascus to Homs (industrial town, ancient Emesa) and cross open desert road to Palmyra, ancient city and capital of the anti-Roman Queen Zenobia, deserted in the sandy desert (Temple of Baal Shamin, Roman theatre, colonnades, tombs, Arab castle).

Palmyra - Aleppo (220 miles) Date .21.0ctober.1980......

Palmyra, Homs, Hama, on the Orontes River, ancient waterwheels "Norias turn day and night, steel industry, citizens noted for their piety. Drive along red-earth uplands to Maarat ann-Numan (Arab fortress on the site of a former Graeco-Roman Castle), Saraqueb to Aleppo.

32 In Aleppa Date _22.0ctober,1980......

Old caravam city, impressive ramparts. magnificent citadel, covered souks (markets), the Great Mosque, Armenian churches and Archaeological Museum, modern quarters with fine buildings, fountains and university.

33 Aleppo - Mersin (218 miles) Date .23.0ctober.1980......

Aleppo: Bab-el-Hawa - SYRIAN/TURKISH

border - Iskenderun, Toprakkale (Frankish/Armenian fortress), Adama (cotton), Tarsus (home of St Paul),

34 Mersin - Alanya (232 miles) Date .24.0ctober.1980......

Mersin, Kiz Kalesi (land and sea castles), Silifke, Anamur (läth century castle and curtain-wall), Gazipasa (fishing village), banama plantations. Alanya; old harbour, Red Tower, promontory citadel with creneliated walls, towers, excellent

35 <u>Alanya - Antalya</u> (95 miles) Date 25 October 1980

Alanya, Manavgat, Side (Roman and Hellenistic ruins), Aspendos (famous for its Roman theatre in an excellent state of preservation, acropolis and aqueducts), Antalya (Hadrians Gate. Roman walls).

36 Antalya - Pamukkale (195 miles) Date 26 October 1980

Antalya, climb onto Anatolian plateau to Burdur on Take Burdur (2,770 ft); Dinar (ancient Apamea, carpet making) Cardak (13th century Caravanserai). Denizli, ascend to Pamukkale, "Cotton fortress".

37 In Pamukkale Date 27 October 1980

Pamukkale lies on a plateau of Travertime formed by the Calcaresus deposits of fast flowing hot springs, cliff-face natural basins and pools, swimming. Explore ancient Roman Hieropolis - theatre, monumental Gate, Martyrium of St Philip the

38 Pamukkale - Kusadasi (140 miles) Date 28 October 1980

Descend from the central plateau via the Menderes Yalley, Saraykoy, (wheat), Aydin, Selcuk - visit ancient Ephesus, Graeco - Roman City, visited by St Paul, major trade and cultural centre of the ancient world, an outstanding site, continue to Kusadasi, picturesque fishing village.

39 Kusadasi - Canakkale (280 miles) Date .29.October, 1980,......

Return to Selcuk, Izmir (large port, old Smyrna, now major Turkish export and industrial centre), round Gulf of lamir to fertile plain of Gedes (cotton, tobacco), Bergama, (ancient Pergamum, visit Aesclepion). Ayralik, plive groves, Edremit, through hilly country to Truva (ancient Troy), Canakkale.

Camakkale - Thassos (235 miles) Date 30 October 1980

Ferry from Canakkale across the Dardanelles to Eceabat on the Gallipoli peninsular, visit area of the 1915 - 1916 Gallipoli Campaign, war cemetries. Anzac Core, winding hill roads up the peninsular to hill roads up the pennistra Kesan (military base), lpsala Days

 TURKISH/GREEK border - Meric River, Alexandroupolis (port), view Samothrace Island, cross Greek Thrace to Komotini and Kavalla, ferry to Thasos.

41 <u>In Thasos</u> Daté <u>31</u> October 1980

Thasos is a hilly and pretty island colonised by Ionian emigrees around the 8th century 8C, which became a kind of outpost of Hellenic civilisation in the barbarian world. (Sanctuary of Poseidon and Dionysos, Agora, Museum, theatre, acropolis, and beaches).

42 <u>Thasos - Salonika</u> (100 miles) Date 1 November 1980

Ferry back to Kavalla, (second largest town of Macedonia, port, fishing harbour, ottoman aqueduct and castle dominating town), plains of Philippi (where Mark Anthony defeated Brutus 42 BC), cross Strymon River, drive across neck of Chalkidiki peninsular, lake Yolvo, Salonika (second city of Greece, industrial centre, port, Arch of Galerius, Byzantine churches).

43 <u>Salonika - Meteora (175 miles)</u> Date 2 November 1980

Salonika, motorway round head of Thermaic Gulf, cross Aliakmon River, pass near Pella (birthplace of Alexander) Katernini, Mount Olympus (home of the Gods, Highest mountain in Greece), Larisa, Trikkala, Kalambaka.

44 Meteora - Delphi (175 miles) Date 3 November 1980

Visit Meteora (sight of several 14th century monasteries amidst intriguing landscapes), then south to Karditsa, on to plain of Thessaly, over Furka Pass, descend into Lamia (regional tapita), agricultural/market centre), climb through Parnassos and Kallidromon mountains, via Plain of Itea (largest olive groves in Greece), Amphissa, Delphi, perched on side of Mount Parnassos (Delphic oracle site, museum). Impressive views of Pleistos valley and Gulf of Corinth.

45 Delphi - Athens (105 miles) Date . 4 November 1980

Free morning in Delphi, Arakhova village (honey, carpets), old Turkish town of Levadia, winding hilly country road to Thebes (site of famous city-state and setting for part of the Dedipus story), Bay of Elefsis (sanctuary of Earth-Mother Demeter), Daphne, Athens.

46/47 <u>In Athens</u>

Date ...5/6.Mqvember.1980...

Greek Capital; 5th century Acropolis (Parthenon, Erechtheum, Temple of Athena Mike), National Archaeological Museum, shopping, day cruises to islands, Plaka old quarter. Days

48 <u>Athens - Karachi Flight</u>

Daite ...7. November 1980

Airport transfer, Alia Flight Athens/ Amman/Karachi - Pakistan, Transfer to hotel.

49/50 <u>In Karachi</u>

Date .8/9.November.1980

Karachi, first capital of Pakistan, principal Commercial Centre of Pakistan and busy shipping port; old Government House, Trinity Church, Empress Market, swimming at Sandspit, Hawkes Bay and Two Mile Beach.

51 Karachi - Sukkur (290 miles) Date .10.November.1980.....

Follow the irrigated Indus River Valley through the Sind to Myderabad, Ranipur, Khairpur and Sukkur,

52 <u>Sukkur - Multan</u> (280 miles) Date .]] November 1980

Sukkur, Rohri, travel north along the Indus Valley to Rahim yar Khan, cross the Chenab River, to Multan (fort, Mausoleum of Rukn-ud-din).

53 Multan - Lahore (210 miles) Date .12.November 1980

Multan, Khanewal, Sahival (formerly Montgomery), short diversion to the ruins of Harappa (early Indus River civilisation contemporary with Sumeria, 2,500 - 1,500 BC), Changa Manga forest, north along the Ravi River to Lahore, former capital of Pakistan, busy vital city of modern Pakistan.

54 In Lahore

Date . J3, November 1980

Lahore, an old Moghul capital; Lahore Fort, Pearl Mosque (1627), Badshahi Mosque (one of the world's largest), Shallmar Gardens, Kim's Gun from Kipling's days, central museum, old bazaar quarter.

55 <u>Lahore - Amritsar</u> (30 miles) Date 14 November 1980

Lahore, cross State of Punjab to Wagah - INDIAN/PAKISTAN border - Amritser (manufacture of Pashmina, silk and carpets) religious Capital of the Sikhs, ceremonies focus on the great Golden Temple in the centre of a pool approached by a white marbe causeway.

56 Amritsar - Jammu (140 miles) Date 15 November 1980

Amritsar, Dariwal (wheat), cross Ravi River to enter Jammu and Kashmir district, Pathankot, Jammu city (winter capital of Kashmir's rulers).

57 Jammu - Srinagar (180 miles) Date 16 November 1980

Jammu, climb to 7,000 ft, Patnitep, village of Batote, descend to Chenab River (controlled by India, vital to Pakistan), Ramban (2,250 ft), Banihal Pass (9,000 ft), Kashmiri capital, Srinagar. Day of spectacular mountain

scenery.

58/59/60 <u>In Srinagar</u>

Daites 17/18/19, November, 1980.

Srinagar (average height 5,200 ft), stay on houseboats. Boating trips, walking, explore markets, gardens (Nishat Bagh - Garden of Pleasure, or Shalimar Bagh), Friday Mosque, Sri Pata Singh Museum. Take trip to Gulmarg (ski resort - 8,500 ft) walking, horse riding. Views of Nanga Parbat over 26,000 ft.

61 <u>Srinagar - Jammu</u> (180 miles) Date 20 November 1980

Srinagar, return through the vale of Kashmir, Banihal, Ramban, cross Chenab River, Batote, over Patnitop, descend to Jammu.

62 <u>Jammu - Delhi</u> (300 miles) Date 21 November 1980

Jammu, Pathankot, ancient capital of Jullunder, cross Sutlej River, Ludhiana (hosiery centre), Ambala (grain, sugar), cross Plain of Panipat (scene of 3 great battles), continue on Grand Trunk Road to Delhi.

63/64 <u>In Delhi</u> Dates 22/23 November 1980

New Delhi; capital of India; Secretariat, Government House, Parliament, India Gate, Connaught Circus (business centre), Old Delhi; Chadni Chowk (bazaar area) Great Mosque, National Museum, Red Fort (see son et lumiere). Qutb Minar, Government Handicraft Emportums (fixed prices).

66 <u>Delhi - Jaipu</u>r (207 miles) Date .24 November 1980

Delhi, cross into the state of Rajasthan, Alwar, Sariska Game Reserve, Shahpura, Rajput Amber Palace (high on rocky outcrop), to Jaipur.

66 <u>In Jaipur</u>

Date 25 November 1980

Jaipur, known as "Pink City" due to sandstone used in construction of many of its buildings, such as Chandra Mahal Palace, house of the winds, Observatory of Jai Singh, capital of Rajasthan, jewellery working centre.

67 <u>Jaipur - Agra</u> (158 miles) Date 26 November 1980

Jaipur, Dasau, Bharatpur bird sanctuary, set amidst lakes. Fatehpur Sikri (city built in red sandstone by Emperor Akbar, deserted after brief period), Agra.

68 In Agra

Date . 27. November, 1980

City of the Taj Mahal (built 1630 -1852 by Moghu) Emperor Shah Jahan), Agra Red Fort (one of the best), Sikandra (Akbar's Tomb) on banks of Jumna River, 69 Agra - Khajuraho (265 miles) Date ...28.November.1980....

Agra, cross Chambal River at construction site of new bridge, Gwalior (classical Indian Fortress towering over town), cross Betwa and Onasan Rivers, Nowgong, cross Kan River, small village of Khajuraho, famous 1,000 year old complex of temples (south Indian Style) intricately carved exteriors.

70 <u>Khajuraho - Benares</u> (260 miles) Date ...29.November, 1980....

Travel through wooded Yindhya hills to scrub country, Panna (diamond mines), Rewa (first white tiger captured), cross northern extremities of Deccan Plateau. Descend abruptly from the Plateau to the Banges Valley, Mirzapur (carpets, brasswork), cross massive bridge over the Ganges River to Benares.

71 In Benares

Date .30.November.1980.....

Holy city to Hindus, early morning boat ride along temple lined Ganges River, see devotees bathing, cremations. Sarnath, holy site to Buddhists, where Buddha preached his first sermon. Maharajah's Palace.

72 Benares - Bhairama Date .1.December 1980.....

Leave Benares (also known as Varanasi), Ghazipur, cross Ganges River, Gorakhpur, cross Indian State of Bihar (one of India's poorest states), - INDIAN/MEP-ALESE border - Bhairawa.

73 Bhairawa - Pokhara (115 miles)
- Date ... Pecember 1980.....

Shairawa, cross low Terai region which is intensively cultivated. Butwal, ascend to the Siwalik Ranges, to high Pokhara valley, Pokhara.

74 In Pokhara

Date .3. December, 1980.....

A beautiful valley (3,000 ft) subtropical vegetation, bananas etc., Phewa Lake, views of 18,000 ft Machupachare (Fishtail Peak). Hill walks, Tibetan Refugee Centre.

75 Pokhara - Kathmandu (128 miles)
Date . 4 December 1980.....

From Pokhara follow the Yalley of River Seti, Damauli, Mugling, beautiful mountain scenery. Follow River Trisuli (terraced rice paddies) Naubise, through western Kathmandu Valley, to Pennworld Terminus at the Blue Star Hotel, Kathmandu.

76/77 In Kathmandu Dates 5/6 December 1980

Time to wander through the markets and Durbar Square - flanked by the "Old palace and "Temple of the Living Goddess", visit the National Museum, the pagoda like Temple of Machendra Bahal and Singha Durba, palace of

the Rana family.

Kathmandu is also an ideal centre for exploring the other towns and places of interest in the Valley. Like Patan (Tibetan Refugee Centre, Medieval Durbar Square, Krishna Mandir), Bhadgdon (Durbar Square, the Golden Gate, palace of 55 windows and Nyatapola Temple), Bodnath Stupa, Pashupatinath (the most sacred Shaivite Temple in Nepal), and Swayambhundth (2,000 year old Stupa) only 2 miles from Kathmandu.

Ohulikhel is an ideal spot from which to view the surrise over the northeastern ranges of the Himalayas.

A one hour flight along the Himalayas to Mount Everest is operated daily by Royal Nepalese Airlines if weather conditions permit.

There is also a full day excursion to Kodari on the Mepalese/Chinese border offered by most local tour operators.
